CANONIZATION

What does it take to become a saint? A cause for canonization begins in a diocese, usually the diocese in which the person lived or died. In many cases a group will petition the local bishop to open an investigation into the virtues of the person. Once the bishop agrees to open the investigation and begin the process, the person becomes known as "Servant of God."

This process normally begins five years or more after the person's death. The Pope has the authority to waive this rule, as was the case with Mother Theresa and Pope John Paul II.

A guild is formed, tasked with doing a thorough investigation of the candidate's life, their writings, speeches and sermons. A detailed biography is written, and if there are living individuals who knew the person, they are interviewed.

From there the bishop presents the information gathered about the Servant of God to a Vatican office called the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints. The congregation then assigns a postulator to the cause, whose job is to continue gathering more information about the Servant of God.

The steps to sainthood in the Catholic Church are Servant of God, Venerable, Blessed, and Saint.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In many parish churches, more rarely in monastery churches and cathedrals, the tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament is visible from a doorway or aisle in the church. Normally, a person is to give the proper sign of reverence, a genuflection, when passing in proximity to the tabernacle. The word "genuflect" comes from Latin roots meaning bending (or flexing) the knee. A common-sense exception to the rule is for a sacristan who is taking care of the church and can't be genuflecting every thirty seconds during a vacuum run. Also excepted are persons in procession entrusted with important symbols of the Lord's presence. So, a crossbearer or a minister carrying the Gospel book, or ministers on their way to their Communion stations do not genuflect. For everyone else, the usual sign of reverence for the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament is to genuflect on the right knee.

The oldest form of reverence during prayer in our tradition is standing; kneeling or genuflecting is a sign borrowed from old civic practice. The posture of kneeling, even on one knee, is a sign of submission. Servants would take this position before their masters in the ancient world. It said: I'm not running away, I'm yours, I'm here for you. This is what your genuflection says when you enter a Catholic church where the place of reservation of the Blessed Sacrament is visible to you: I'm yours.

THE WAY

Today we sense the apostles' trepidation as they begin to realize that the Lord would soon be leaving them. In their fear, they ask, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" (John 14:5). Jesus tells them that *he* is the way. The Easter season has been a time of growing in Easter faith so that we, too, may learn to know that Jesus is the way. We can take comfort in the Lord's promise that he is going to his Father's house to prepare a place for us, his chosen people who have been called out of darkness into God's wonderful light. As the paschal candle continues to burn during this holy season, let us remember that in baptism we were given the light of Christ. With Christ our light as the beacon lighting our way, let us march toward the glory of Pentecost.
